2018-2019 Special Project Funding

Funding is available for projects that occur between April 1st, 2018 and March 31st, 2019.

Special Project Funding focuses on the early stages of the LTAD model, specifically First Contact/Recruitment up to the Train to Train stage, in addition to the Competitive/Active for Life stages.

In this year's funding model there are **3 main categories:**

1. *Promotion and Recruitment*
2. *Program Participation*
3. *Coach, Coach Developer, Player, & Official Development*

And **1 additional category:**

1. *Hosting a NCCP Competition Introduction Course*

You may apply to:

- **A maximum of 2 main categories/projects**
 - **A maximum of 1 project per category**
- **A maximum of 1 Hosting a NCCP Competition Introduction Course**
- **Additional projects over and above the 2 main projects, if they are deemed to be innovative solutions for the development and recruitment of women.**

Successful applicants will be notified and will receive the funds once a final report is received along with relevant receipts and a completed registration form. Applicants who wish to make changes to their proposed project must do so in writing no fewer than 2 weeks before the start of the project. Project changes must be approved by the Special Projects Funding Committee before they take place.

Applications for Special Project Funding (see separate document) are due by email to Sean Liebich by end of day **September 30, 2018**. Late applications will not be considered.

Final reports and receipts are due no later than March 16, 2019. **Late reports will not be eligible to receive funding.**

The SPF program will be reviewed on an annual basis. We do anticipate the program will continue to change as we move further along with the implementation of the LTAD model.
