

Wheelchair Basketball Canada (WBC)
National Team Selection Process
2025 IWBF 3X3 World Championships

1. Introduction

The purpose of this document is to outline the process for Wheelchair Basketball Canada (WBC) to select four (4) athletes and two (2) alternates to represent Canada at the 2025 IWBF 3X3 World Championships in Sun City, South Africa.

National team selection for 3x3 will include considerations between assembling a team to podium at the event and providing opportunities for emerging senior team athletes in the 5v5 stream.

2. Timing

The athletes and alternates selected to the 2025 IWBF 3x3 World Championships National Team will be made known to the national team pool athletes no later than June 10th, 2025. The National Team athletes will be formally announced to the public on/or after the appeal period (7 days) has passed.

3. Decision making process

The final recommendation for selection to the National Team is made by the WBC selection committee which consists of the:

- High-Performance Director,
- Program Head Coach, and
- Next Gen Player Development Coordinator

April 2025

- WBC will communicate an opportunity for AAP athletes to provide a declaration of interest for consideration to be selected to represent Canada at the 2025 IWBF 3X3 World Championships in Sun City, South Africa.
- Communication to declare interest sent by email to athletes Thursday April 24th, 2025
- Deadline to declare interest by email is Wednesday April 30th, 2025
- Athlete list for consideration to represent Canada at the 2025 IWBF 3x3 World Championships in Sun City, South Africa is compiled and shared with the WBC selection committee

May 2025:

- WBC selection committee contacts nominated athletes and alternates by May 15th, 2025

4. Evaluation Events

Ongoing – September 2023 to April 2025

Domestic club, professional, university, provincial team camps, National team and games and competitions.

March 2025

Junior West Championship – March 28-30, 2025

April 2025

IWBF Men's U23 Americas Championship – March 30 to April 6, 2025

Junior East Championship – April 4-5, 2025

CWBL Finals – April 10-13, 2025

5. Eligibility

Athletes must be Canadian citizens, or otherwise eligible to compete for Canada according to IWBF regulations and be members in good standing with Wheelchair Basketball Canada.

Athletes must have an eligible Impairment for the sport of Wheelchair Basketball and player meets the IWBF minimum impairment criteria and be deemed eligible by the IWBF classification rules to be considered for selection to the National Team.

The WBC selection committee has the final authority on deciding whether an athlete should be included for final consideration.

6. Criteria for Selection

The primary criteria for selecting athletes to camps and National Teams is led by the Next Gen Player Development Coordinator and is outlined below.

- Use WBC's Gold Medal Profile to evaluate the athlete's position on the depth chart,
- Emerging senior team athletes with Gold Medal Profile attributes to challenge for a senior national team position for the 2026 Worlds and the 2028 Paralympics,
- Medical/Physical status at the time of selection and projected availability,
- Factors related to team cohesion and dynamics, including acceptance and execution of presented roles,
- Based on confirmed classification, the athlete can contribute within proposed line-ups,
- Special line-up combinations, and
- Substitution for players in the primary line-ups are met.

Additional criteria for consideration:

- Commitment to WBC's National Team High Performance Values,
- The ability of the athlete to travel independently to National Team camps/competitions.
- Commitment to the program and to training as demonstrated through attendance at training, camps and competition throughout the year
- Commitment to regular and prompt communication as requested with WBC and program team staff
- Consistent reporting and submission of training reports as required in the athlete's monitoring system.
- Ability to fit the overall team style of play (speed, full-court press, back-picking, high tempo defense, fast breaking)
- Evaluation during the year in competitive events at an elite level.

NB: Being nominated for a Senior card does not guarantee that an athlete will be selected to the National Team to represent Canada at any major competition (Paralympics, World Championship, Qualification Tournament).

Using these criteria, the WBC Selection Committee will choose a team to represent Canada that provides a cohesive environment, an opportunity for emerging senior team athletes and positions Canada to challenge for the podium.

7. WBC athlete program standards

National Team athletes' post-selection criteria

Athletes selected to the National Team may be removed from the roster for any 2025 events, up until the final IWBF deadlines, under the following scenarios:

- Failure to meet training or competition commitments, as determined by the WBC selection committee.
- Injury or illness that will prevent them from training properly in advance of, and/or competing at a high enough level. (as determined by the program medical staff in consultation with the WBC selection committee);
- Violation of the WBC Athlete Agreement.
- Gross breach of discipline, as per the WBC Code of Conduct.
- Investigation for cause; and
- Violations of anti-doping rules.

8. Appeals

An athlete who wishes to appeal the decision of the WBC Selection Committee regarding their position as a member of the National Team that will represent Canada has the right to do so, by following the WBC Appeals Policy (available at www.wheelchairbasketball.ca or through the National Office). They will have 7 days from the time of the Selection date to file an appeal.
